

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 6

WHEREAS, the Office of Minority Business Enterprise, hereinafter referred to as OMBE, presently functions to provide information and assistance to minority businesses concerning state government purchasing; and

WHEREAS, since June 21, 1994, under Executive Order No. 22, the OMBE has operated under the control of the Department of Finance, Division of Purchasing where it was transferred from the Alabama Development Office; and

WHEREAS, the operation of the OMBE should be the responsibility of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, hereinafter referred to as ADECA.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Fob James, Jr., Governor of the State of Alabama, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Alabama, and for other good and valid reasons which relate thereto, do hereby transfer the OMBE to ADECA.

IT IS ORDERED that all powers, duties and authority of the OMBE, established by Executive Order No. 89, dated July 26, 1978, are also hereby transferred and granted to ADECA.


BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Director of Finance and the Director of ADECA shall take all actions necessary to transfer all personnel, equipment, assets, supplies, inventories and accounts receivable, as well as legal obligations, of the OMBE and ADECA.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Director of Finance and the Director of ADECA shall take all actions required by {41-19-10(e), Code of Alabama (1975)}, to transfer all unexpended or unencumbered sums appropriated to the OMBE from the Department of Finance to ADECA.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this Executive Order become effective immediately upon signing and shall remain in force until modified or rescinded.
