In the same month he was sent to Mela Park, Cleveland, Ohio to be stationed with the Development Division of the Chemical Warfare Service. His commanders at Cleveland were F. M. Morsey, Col. Chemical Warfare Service J. R. Bluff, Capt. Chemical Warfare Service. While in Cleveland he was taken ill with the Spanish influenza, pneumonia following from which he died ^{Sunday} Oct. 20, 1918. He was buried from his home in Thorsby, Ala. Oct. 25, 1918.
