Subject; Recommendation for Decorations.

1. I recommend that the following named enlisted man receive the CROIX-de-GUERRE for unusual acts of gallantry in action, as set forth specifically below, while serving with the 153d R.I. French.

I. (a) Color Sergeant Henry Brosemer, #559339, Headquarters Company, 58th Infantry.

(b) July 18, 1918, near Chezy and Chevillon, France.

(c) Mrs Gertrude Brosemer, (Wife) Box 365, Gillette Wyo.

(d) On the morning of July 18th, 1918, Color Sergeant Henry Brosemer, (after being Painfully Wounded) requested permission from the Battalion Commander to accompany him in the advance, although he knew that this would subject him to heavy machine gun fire and a terrific bombardment by the artillery. Sergeant Brosemer efficiently took charge of and led a platoon during the fight when no Officers were available, During this engagement he showed exceptional courage and bravery, and as a result of his devotion to duty the attack which was influenced to a ~~in~~ great extent by the Platoon under his charge, was very successful.
