Hospital #14 and sailed from Bordeaux Jan. 29th, 1919,
landed Feb. 13, 1919 at New York. He was carried to Red
Cross Debarcation Hospital #3 where he remained until his death
Apr. 27, 1919. He was buried at Wrights Chapel Cemetery
May 1, 1919.
