Emanuel Bagwell saw service in the
civil war of 1861-65, was wounded in the
head and did not ever entirely recover
from it, could not hear good any more.
He was a talented workman, while
in prison during the Civil war he made
finger rings of gutta percha and put silver sets
in them and sold to the soldier boys.

Said Emanuel Bagwell, ^{was born} Aug 6, 1825, and died
Jan 15, 1902. He was a carpenter and blacksmith
by trade. Could also make shoes, prepared all
the material which went into ^{the} finished shoe
except the flax thread. Also made all the
implements ^{to} used in weaving cloth, reels
spinning wheels and looms. Made wagons
and other vehicles. He was the son of
Wiley Bagwell and Pollyann Bagwell
of Fayette, Ala. The Bagwell family came
across from England with the Oglethorpe
Colonists who settled Savannah, Ga.

Mary Matilda Bagwell, wife of Emanuel
Bagwell was born Jan 27, 1842 and died
Jan 28 1877.
