

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

When in battle on July 30th 1918, he was hit by a sharpshooter and four other comrades by the same sharpshooter, killing them instantly, but he lived about 20 minutes, when disarmed by some, they stopped and asked him if they could be of assistance to him - He replied, no boys, don't bother with me, I'm alright - an abba, and he continued to fire at the enemy until he got so weak the gun slipped from his hands.
