ADAH expert genealogist, Nancy Dupree, will lead this half-day workshop specifically tailored to those interested in researching African American ancestors. This workshop will focus on the basics for beginners and also provide more experienced participants valuable tools for taking their research to the next level.

This workshop will offer step-by-step instruction and guidance on the many resources available in the ADAH's EBSCO Research Room. Dupree will devote time to providing tips and tricks for navigating potential research roadblocks and addressing challenges specific to African American genealogical research. This workshop is suited for all levels of research experience.
