Cultural Crossroads Returns to ADAH

Historians and archaeologists will discuss events in the late 18th and early 19th centuries that led to the Creek-American War of 1813-14. The death of Creek leader Alexander McGillivray in 1793 and other events on the Alabama frontier, including the development of the Federal Road, challenged the Creeks' control of their traditional homeland. Speakers to discuss these events include Dr. Ed Bridges, David Robb, Gary Burton, Greg Spies, Raven Christopher, Dr. Terry Winemiller, and Mark Dauber, with a brief introduction by Mary Ann Neeley.
