-> ADMISSION

Admission and cost for group tours of the Museum of Alabama is always FREE!

→ GROUP SIZES

Guided tours are designed for 15 people or more. Groups larger than 30 may be divided into smaller tour units. Please note that group size includes teachers and chaperones. If galleries are at capacity, chaperones may be asked to wait in the lobby to ensure safety and the quality of the students' visit. See individual tour descriptions for group size guidelines.

→ MUSEUM STORE

Groups are encouraged to enjoy brown bag lunches on our front lawn, terrace, and 12 picnic tables. No indoor seating is available. Several restaurants are within walking distance of the museum. Ask our front desk staff for directions.

→ DIRECTIONS

The Museum of Alabama is located inside the Alabama Department of Archives and History at 624 Washington Avenue. We are directly across the street from the State Capitol. Limited parking for buses and cars is available in a lot behind the Archives' building on Adams Ave. Free parking is also available on Bainbridge St., south of Adams.

About Our Exhibits



ALABAMA VOICES

Alabama Voices covers the dramatic unfolding of Alabama history from the dawn of the 1700s to the beginning of the 21st century. More than 800 artifacts, hundreds of images and documents, and twenty-two audiovisual programs tell the story of struggles over the land, the rise of a cotton economy, the Civil War, industrialization, world wars, civil rights, the race to the moon, and more. Voices taken from diaries, letters, speeches, songs, and other sources convey the experiences of Alabamians who lived through and shaped the history of the state.

THE FIRST ALABAMIANS

Discover the inspiring story of 14,000 years of Native American history in Alabama. This exhibit includes beautiful murals, maps, a diorama, and artifacts from the Museum's extensive archaeological collection.

THE LAND OF ALABAMA

The story of Alabama begins in the land. Learn about the geography, geology, and biodiversity that set the stage for our state's history.

ALABAMA TREASURES

This gallery features temporary exhibits that highlight the rich history and unique stories of our state and its people.

HANDS-ON GALLERY AND GRANDMA'S ATTIC

Featuring monthly crafts, stories, and dress-up opportunities, this gallery is perfect for children and families.

Tour Guidelines

CANCELLATIONS/LATE ARRIVALS:

If you need to cancel or will arrive late for your scheduled tour, call (334) 242-4364 as soon as possible. <u>Reservations are held for 15 minutes.</u>

LOADING ZONE/PARKING:

Unload and load buses on Bainbridge St. at the corner of Bainbridge and Washington Ave. This is a safe loading zone ONLY. Limited parking for buses and cars is available in the Archives' free parking lot, located directly behind the building on Adams Ave. Unmetered parking is available along Bainbridge St., south of Adams.

ARRIVAL:

All tour groups should enter the front of the building (Washington Ave. entrance). Museum guides will meet your group at this entrance. Large groups will be split into smaller tour units.

TOUR TIME:

Your scheduled time slot includes orientation, exhibit tour, and transition time. The actual time spent in the museum exhibits will be less than your scheduled time slot. Restroom breaks and late arrivals will decrease the amount of time available on the tour.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

Staff often take photographs of tour groups for publicity and promotional purposes. If your group has individuals who are not permitted to have their photograph taken, please inform the staff upon arrival. Photography of the museum exhibits is allowed without flash.

RESTROOMS:


Restroom time is NOT included in your tour time. If your group will need to use the restroom, please inform the staff upon arrival.

FOOD & DRINK:

Food and drink are prohibited inside the museum. We do not have indoor lunch facilities, but encourage groups to picnic on our front terrace and lawn. Twelve picnic tables are available on our terrace.

SOUVENIRS:

We welcome groups to shop <u>before</u> or <u>after</u> their scheduled tour time. If you would like to visit the Museum Store, please inform our staff upon arrival.




